What to expect after COVID-19 vaccine dose 1

MOST COMON SIDE EFFECTS

| In the arm where you got | Throughout the rest of |
|--------------------------|------------------------|
| the shot | your body |
| Pain | Chills |
| Swelling | Tiredness |
| Redness | Headaches |

- These side effects are normal and expected.
- What you are feeling is your immune system getting stronger so you can fight the virus
- If you don't have side effects, it doesn't mean the vaccine is not working.
- If you need to, you can take Tylenol 4 hours after getting the shot (follow directions on bottle).
- Most side effects are mild to moderate and last 1 to 3 days.

About the COVID-19 vaccine

- The COVID-19 vaccine is NOT a live virus vaccine.
- You cannot get COVID-19 from the vaccine!
- The vaccine is 95% effective in preventing COVID-19 only if you get both doses.
- We don't know how long the protection will last.
- You may still be able to carry the virus to someone else.

WHAT TO DO NEXT

- It's very important to get the second dose!
