KIDS' CLOSET: CLOTHING, CARE, AND COMMUNITY

As any parent knows, keeping your children supplied with clothes that fit is no easy task. Children grow so fast that a favorite shirt that fits at the beginning of the year is out-of-commission by year's end. Factor in the high prices of all basic needs these days, and it's no surprise that making sure a child has a closet full of clothing is a challenge for parents who come to Samaritan House. That's where Kids' Closet comes in.

At Kids' Closet, parents and their children can come get clothes every month. For parents living on a tight budget, this means they are able to keep their kids clothed without having to make difficult choices between clothing and paying the bills. But Kids' Closet is more than just a place to get clothes. Mary, who has been a volunteer at Samaritan House for 10 years, speaks with clients regularly to schedule their visits. For our clients, Mary is not just a connection to much-needed clothing, she's also a steady confidant to talk to about what's going on in their lives.

One client recently confided in Mary about her cancer journey as a single mother. "When we talk, she tells me how she's doing. It helps her to have someone to tell that to because she can't talk about it to her kids," Mary explains. Mary has heard it all from parents calling in. Some even share photos of their children in their new favorite outfits. For Mary, it feels good to know that

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her conversations with them go beyond just scheduling an appointment. To these parents, Mary represents the larger caring community that is Samaritan House, always ready to listen and to help.

For children, too, the clothes they get from Samaritan House are more than just clothes, Mary shares. "Clothing is essential, but it's also about how it makes them feel." It's about having clothing that fits well and helps them feel just like all the other kids in their classrooms. "We want the kids to experience a sense of dignity." Having access to these clothes, along with school supplies in August, means our littlest clients are able to go into the world with confidence and dignity. For many, that's as important as the clothes themselves.

Donations of new and gently used clothing are always accepted, and monetary donations to our Kids' Closet Essentials Fund ensures we have the resources to purchase socks, underwear, and other essentials in every size needed, all year long. LOOKING BACK

This year marks 50 years of Samaritan House. Like any milestone year, it's an opportunity for our community to look back on all the stories from our years of service. Whether you've been with us for decades or just joined our community this year, your stories of giving, volunteering, and supporting are a part of our history.

Earlier this year, a group of long-time supporters gathered at Byrd's Filling Station to talk about their memories of Samaritan House. Many recalled the early days, when our offices were in portables and our team was much smaller. Hearing these memories is a reminder of how far we've come and how many more people we serve today! It also serves as a reminder of how the San Mateo County community comes together time and time again, whenever our neighbors need our help.

One person shared a remarkable story of community over Thanksgiving in 2001. After a burglary left Samaritan House with no turkeys to distribute to our clients, the community came together. For one moment, it seemed Thanksgiving at Samaritan House might be canceled. But as the news of the break-in spread, donations and support poured in. Neighbors from far and wide arrived with turkeys and monetary contributions, all to keep our clients fed through the holiday. A long-time supporter even recalled one car arriving, trunk packed to the brim with turkeys. Once they'd been unloaded, the community member opened their car's back door, revealing even more turkeys waiting to be donated.

This is just one example pulled from our organization's cherished archives, but such a staggering act of generosity is something we've seen time and time again over the last 50 years. You – our supporters, partners, and volunteers – continue to inspire our community through your dedication and care. Samaritan House only exists because of that care and compassion. Thank you.

The Lions Club also hosts vaccine clinics for COVID and the flu, another important service to keep our clients protected and healthy all year round. Samaritan House is proud to partner with the Peninsula Special Interest Lions Club. Together, we ensure that our San Mateo County neighbors stay healthy and access care whenever needed.





FOR YOUR HEALTH

Sequoia Healthcare District (SHD) is another cornerstone partner, whose support has been foundational in advancing Samaritan House's healthcare initiatives. In 2001, the Free Clinic of Redwood City opened its doors with seed funding from SHD. Today, SHD remains the largest benefactor of the clinic, with an average annual investment of \$1.8 million. The year 2016 marked another significant milestone in our partnership, as with SHD's support, Samaritan House proudly unveiled California's first Food Pharmacy—a groundbreaking initiative aimed at addressing food insecurity among our patients and their families. This innovative program has since become a model for similar initiatives across the state, underscoring the transformative impact of our partnership with SHD. We are thankful for their support over these many years and look forward to the continued impact of our partnership as we forge ahead together, driving positive change and advancing the well-being of our community.
