A Message from Our CEO, Laura Bent

This year, we are celebrating 50 years of client-focused, community-driven programs at Samaritan House—and what a journey it has been! Over the last five decades, we've worked to improve the lives of those living in poverty, by engaging our community to help our neighbors stay fed, healthy, clothed, and housed. I'm incredibly proud of what we've achieved together and am deeply grateful for your support.

Samaritan House began as a grassroots effort run by our founder, Dr. Cora Clemons out of her home. Today, we've grown into a vibrant organization with over 150 staff and 1,500 volunteers. In just the past five years, we've doubled our impact, serving more than 29,000 clients this year. This remarkable growth is a testament to our community's generosity and belief in our mission. Our success comes from putting clients first, listening to their stories, and always adapting our programs to meet their needs.

This year, we've made great strides, including:

- **Renovating our San Mateo Clinic:** Our newly renovated clinic enhances our capacity to provide high-quality physical, mental, dental, and overall health care. The modern, welcoming facility brings hope and healing to every patient we serve.
- **Hosting our 50th anniversary gala:** Our record-breaking Gala brought together over 660 attendees and raised more than \$1 million. It was a night of celebration and commitment, ensuring we can continue to support the growing number of families who rely on us.
- **Designing our newest program, LIFT (Lifeline to Ignite Financial Transformation):** This year, we have been diligently planning for the launch of our LIFT pilot program, which will officially kick off this fall. LIFT is designed as a new, innovative pilot that will provide supplemental income and economic and social case management to help single mothers achieve financial stability and their individual career goals. We are excited to embark on this new pilot program and further our commitment to lifting lives.

Every day, our dedicated team of staff, volunteers, and supporters meet the growing needs of our community. Each day our case managers work with over 80 people, our dining room serves more than 100 hungry neighbors, our food line and market provide groceries for more than 200 families, and our 226 shelter beds are almost always full.



Samaritan House is a lifeline for those facing difficult times. New challenges undoubtedly lie ahead of us, but I know that this year and every year to come, Samaritan House will be here to meet those challenges. For neighbors who are facing crises, both personal and community-wide, our collective unwavering support is indispensable. I hear it from clients everyday: when they're going through a difficult time, they know they can come to us for help.

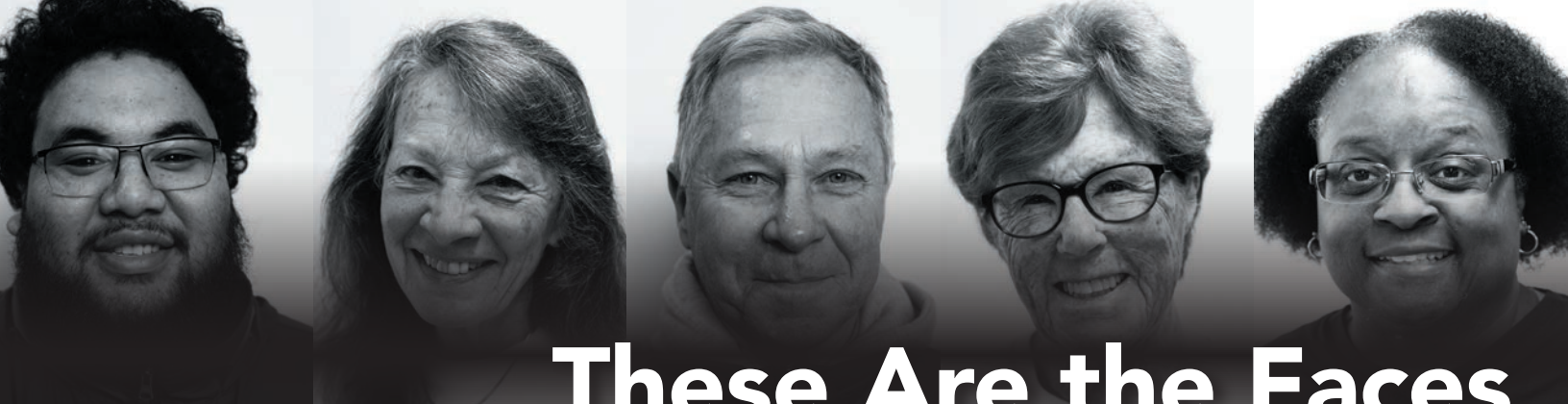

A Family's Fight Against Food Insecurity

Elena first discovered Samaritan House during the COVID-19 pandemic when she needed extra support to keep her family fed. Living in Burlingame with her husband and two children, she quickly found that life in the Bay Area posed serious challenges. The high cost of living and limited job opportunities made it difficult to make ends meet. "Living in the Bay Area is expensive for us, and it just keeps getting harder," Elena explains. Although her husband drives for Uber, business has slowed down, and gas prices have taken a toll. "With gasoline and everything, there isn't much left in his paycheck."

Elena was introduced to Samaritan House by a friend who receives free groceries from Cora's Community Market, Samaritan House's food pantry. The market is designed to look and feel like a neighborhood grocery store and provides a dignified shopping experience with shelves of fresh produce, packaged goods, and refrigerated items. The market has become a lifeline for Elena and her family. "Once we found out about Samaritan House, we came every week."



For her, being able to pick out groceries herself, like eggs and fresh vegetables, makes a world of difference. "It means everything that we can get food here because some stuff we just can't get in the store because the price is so high." Elena's favorite part of coming to Cora's Community Market is the warm and welcoming atmosphere. She never feels shy or embarrassed to visit. "It's a very important part of keeping my family fed." Whenever she meets someone in need, she tells them about Samaritan House. "I help them and guide them to Samaritan House. I bring so many people here."

For Elena and her family, Samaritan House provides more than just food: it offers a supportive community and a sense of stability in uncertain times. Every visit to the market brings not only nourishment but also comfort in knowing that she is not alone.

As Elena continues to navigate the challenges of living in one of the most expensive regions in the country, she finds strength in the connections she's made and the support she receives at Cora's Community Market. With a heart full of gratitude, Elena knows that this community will always be there for her and her family, helping them through tough times and giving them a reason to smile.

Steps Toward a Secure & Independent Future

Sarah's life took an unexpected turn when domestic violence forced her out of her Northern California home. Leaving with nothing but her clothes, beloved dog, and cat, she found herself couch surfing with friends in San Mateo. Disabled and unable to work, Sarah relied on government assistance that barely covered her basic needs, let alone rent. Her pets, her constant companions through every challenge, added another layer of difficulty in finding a safe place to stay. "They've been my constant through everything I've gone through," Sarah says. Most shelters wouldn't accept her dog and cat, making her journey to stability even harder to navigate.

In 2023, a friend told Sarah about Samaritan House, and she reached out for help. She was connected with Eric, a compassionate case manager who quickly found a solution. Sarah moved into a room at El Camino House, Samaritan House's newest non-congregate shelter, where she could have her own space—a true sanctuary after years of instability. "El Camino House was a roof over my head and a comfortable bed. Knowing I was secure and stable and safe, I was finally able to relax," Sarah reflects.

For the first time in a long time, Sarah felt safe, and she was able to stay with her pets, which meant the world to her. With guidance and regular check-ins from her case managers, Sarah honed her budgeting skills through Samaritan House's financial empowerment program and planned for the future. "Both my case managers were really nice and helpful. They helped me budget and reminded me to save money, which I needed," she says.

By May 2024, Sarah had saved enough to transition to permanent housing. With support from Samaritan House and her family, she moved to a mobile home neighborhood outside the Bay Area, where her mother also lives. For Sarah, being closer to family after years of living far away felt like a new beginning. "I haven't been this close to my family in a long time. A good part of my adult life, I lived hours away," she shares, grateful to be near her mom and the network of support that now surrounds her.



Without the support of Samaritan House, Sarah doesn't know where she would be today. Beyond the financial help and shelter, she found the emotional support she needed to rebuild her life. As she looks to the future, Sarah is hopeful and excited to see what's next.

I'm so grateful for having that security and stabilization to get on my feet and know I'm safe.

A Journey to Health and Hope

When Luis first stepped into the Samaritan House Free Clinic of Redwood City in late 2023, he was worried about his health. Despite working full-time as an automotive painter and managing his daily expenses, the thought of additional medical bills felt overwhelming. “I was noticing changes in my body, my skin, and my eyes. Someone told me about the clinic, so I came,” Luis recalls. At the clinic, he found a place where he could talk openly with doctors about his health concerns—free of charge and without judgment.

Although Luis initially found it challenging to open up, he quickly realized he was in the right place. With each visit, his trust in the clinic’s staff grew, and he felt truly seen and heard. After a thorough evaluation, Luis was diagnosed with diabetes, a discovery that meant significant changes to his lifestyle.

But Luis found he wasn’t alone on this journey. His doctor prescribed essential medication and introduced him to the clinic’s Food Pharmacy, where he met Jill Goldring, Samaritan House’s dedicated Food Pharmacy Coordinator who helped him reimagine his diet with fresh, nutritious foods.

With guidance from Jill and his medical team, Luis embraced the changes. He learned new ways to manage his diabetes, incorporating healthy eating habits and regular exercise into his daily routine. “Without my doctors and without this clinic, I don’t think I would have made it. The people here are the best,” Luis shares. Now, with his blood sugar levels under control and his health on track, Luis is proud of his progress. He lights up when he shares his health achievements with Jill, knowing the clinic staff are celebrating his wins right alongside him.

For Luis, the clinic is more than just a place to get care: it’s a community that lifts him up. “I tell people about the clinic all the time,” he says.

Celebrating Our Committed Volunteers

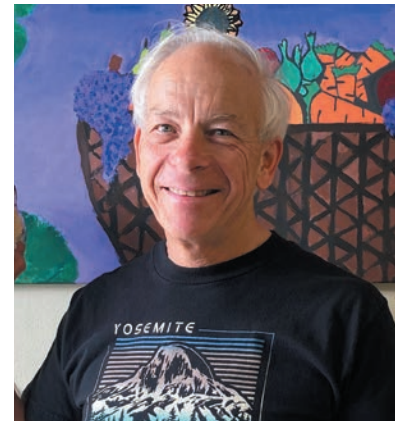

The Dr. Cora Clemons Emerging Young Samaritan Award is inspired by the community service work and selfless spirit of our founder, Dr. Cora Clemons, R.N., M.F.C.C., M.P.H., Ph.D. In 1974, Dr. Clemons was concerned that basic social services like food, housing, and medical care were difficult to access. She saw a need and took action.

Today, Samaritan House is more dedicated than ever to respecting and fulfilling Dr. Clemons' vision and honoring those who joined the fight. The award recognizes young changemakers, 16-22 years old, in San Mateo County, whose community service work models Dr. Clemons' commitment to service and compassion.

In honor of Dr. Clemons' life-long dedication and advocacy, we proudly celebrate the 2023 winner of the Dr. Cora Clemons Emerging Young Samaritan Award: Ethan Hua.

Ethan Hua launched the H.O.P.E. Uniforms Program to provide school uniforms to students in our county through an environmentally conscious initiative.

The program collects gently used school uniforms and redistributes them to families in need at no cost. By allowing students to donate their outgrown uniforms and request the next size up, the program ensures a continuous and sustainable supply of uniforms within the community.

Textile waste is a significant environmental concern, with 22 million tons added to landfills each year. Individual items can take 25 to 45 years to decompose, releasing harmful greenhouse gases during the process. To date, the H.O.P.E. Uniforms Program has received over 8,000 donated clothing items, of which more than 6,300 have been redistributed to families in the community. Ethan's work through this program addresses both environmental and economic challenges by creating a sustainable system that recycles uniforms, reduces waste, and promotes responsible environmental practices.

Samaritan House is proud of the work Ethan has done, we are happy to recognize and award his proactive and inclusive efforts with the Dr. Cora Clemons Emerging Young Samaritan Award.

More than 370 families were provided a total of \$1,080,503 emergency assistance county wide. Because Samaritan House is the fiscal sponsor for this fund, it is not included in the financial statements.

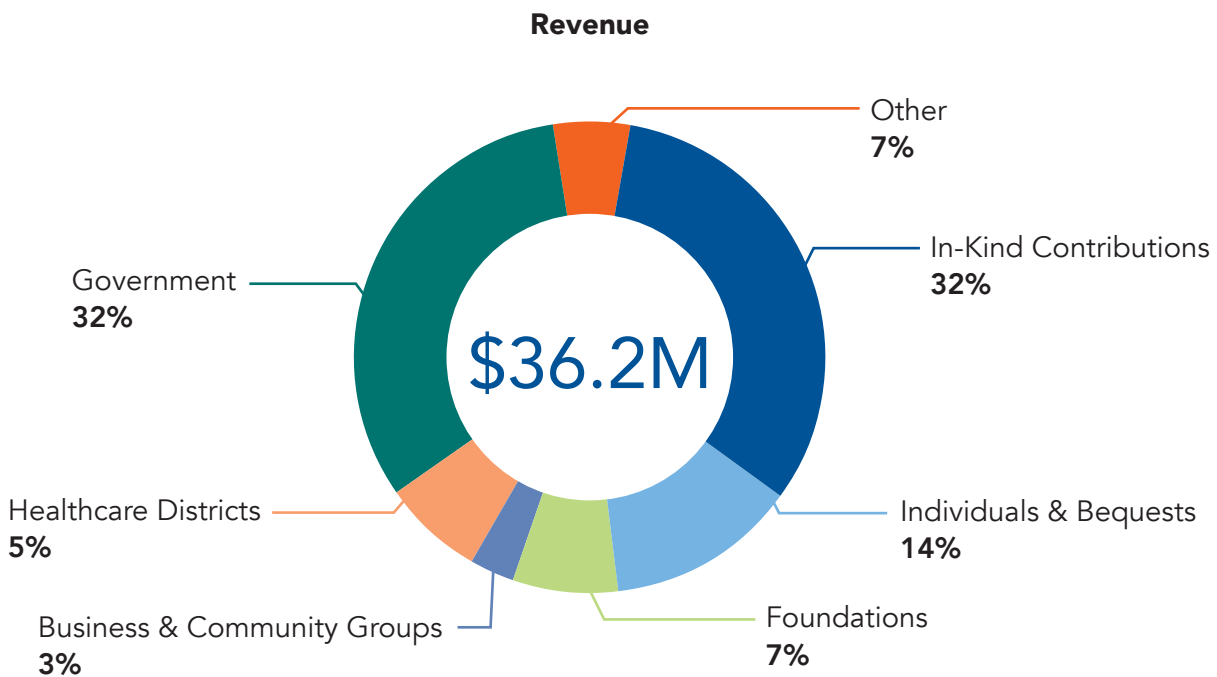

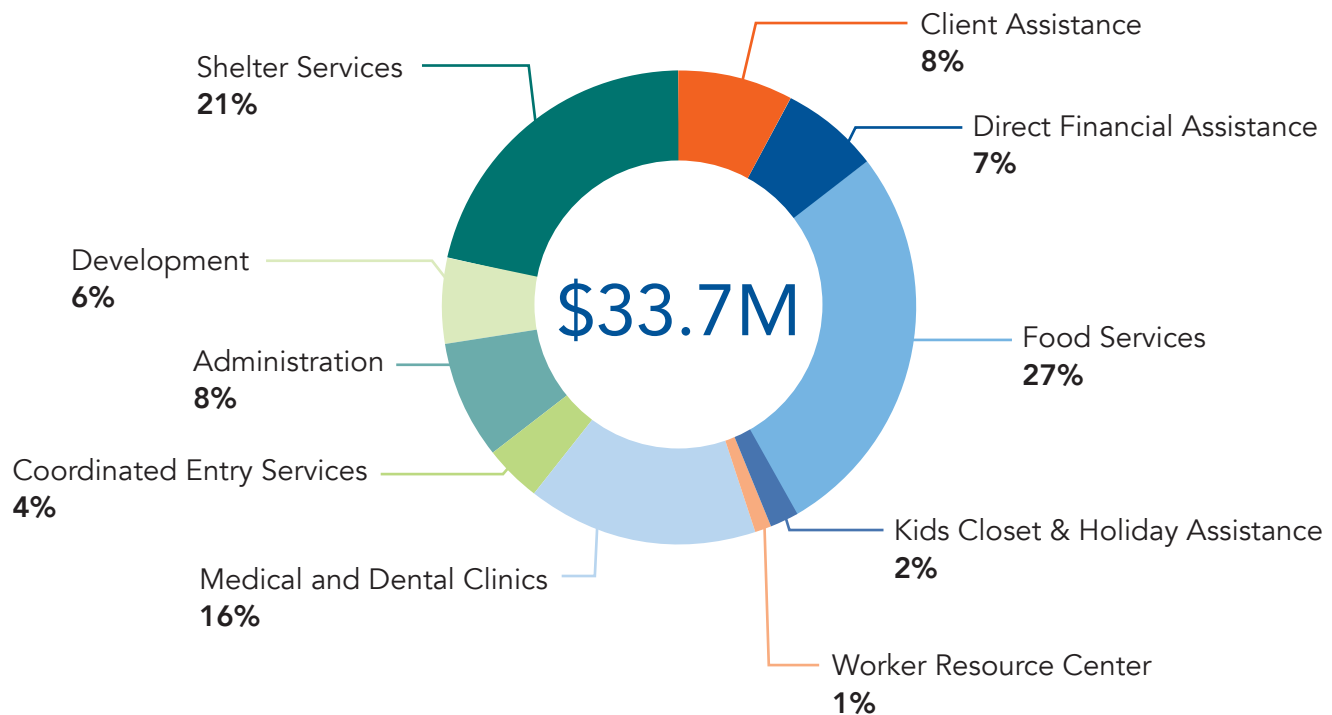
